The agencies talk about how their specific program(s) will address needs of individuals/families in our community the coming year.

Sitting in on the two evenings of allocations gave me direct insight of how much goes into the programs and why they are incredibly important; giving people a chance to thrive and reach their highest potential. I cried both evenings as I drove home reflecting on the stories about community members that were faced with tremendous struggles in the midst of a pandemic, those that had lost their jobs, those that struggled with mental health as they faced isolation from friends & loved

ones and those that were navigating how to provide necessities for their family on reduced hours. So many of us faced challenges over the year, yet the support was unwavering from our donors! It was impressive, inspiring, and humbling to witness our community pulling together, willing to lend a helping hand and financially contribute. This is just one of the reasons I love Marshalltown area! It's a community that displays this year's theme for the Annual Campaign – **United**, **We Are Stronger!**

Our campaign goal this year is \$800,000. Campaign Co-Chairs, Kris & Shannon Naughton and I recognize there is an increased need to raise more funding in order to support one of the new Partner Agencies, The Bridge Home, which addresses shelter and continuum care to those that find themselves in a housing crisis or needing shelter. We are grateful to have The Bridge Home serving the Marshall County area as it fulfills a critical unmet need in our community.

Outside our new agency, there are 27 other Partner Agencies. Each agency supports at least one of the three core United Way's focal points: **Education, Health**, and **Financial Stability**.

Marshalltown Area United Way welcomes NEW Partner Agency The Bridge Home


